MAIN IDEA

We can't hold onto fear and trust Jesus at the same time.

STARTER

Would you rather spend the night in a cave full of spiders or spend the night in a hammock strung between two skyscrapers?

SCRIPTURE EMPHASIS

As a group, read these passages before you begin your discussion:

- 1 John 4:18
- John 16:33
- Romans 8:38-39

UNPACKING WHAT WE TALKED ABOUT...

- Not all early Christians faced persecution, but these passages below describe horrible conditions that some early Christians faced, and many others witnessed:
 - 2 Cor. 11:25
 - Acts 12:1-3
 - Matt. 14:10-12
 - Rev. 1:9

How do you think you would do in conditions like these?

- As Jesus followers, does the current state of our world (and politics) scare you? What are some
 of your fears?
- Fear can bring about one of two reactions:
 - We can react **IN** fear and fight back.
 - We can react **TO** fear by choosing to trust God knows what He is doing

What are some actions you need to take to reject fear and choose to trust God instead?

• Read 1 John 2:15-17. John talks about the 'things of this world' and we automatically think of money and possessions. Is it possible that some of our fear about the state of the world comes from holding on to the 'things of this world' like our culture or country or a way of life that we want to keep hold of? Are we more attached to our politics or preferences than we are with the kingdom of God?

Memorize 1 John 4:18 - "perfect love expels all fear." Recite it when you get scared about what is happening
